Please remember the following points if you are applying:

1. Diversify preferences. Macquarie recommend choosing a range of degrees with varying entry requirements (by using published selection ranks as a guide).
2. Activities provided by students must demonstrate leadership skills, personal development and dedication through extracurricular activities (see [website](#) for examples).
3. Make sure you answer all parts of the reflection questions double-check all parts of

your application before submitting. No changes can be made afterwards.

The two-year Traineeship provides a pathway for young school leavers to work and study at the same time.

Trainees can obtain valuable on-the-job experience and training while completing their TAFE studies. Over the two-year traineeship, participants will study one day per week with NSW TAFE towards a Certificate IV in Business, Project Management Practice and Procurement and Contracting while working in different roles across government, private industry and consultancy firms. It is an excellent way to gain nationally recognised qualifications and on-the-job experience.

Students can now complete one form to be considered for most scholarships at the University of Sydney*. High School students will need their most recent school report or HSC trial results, to answer self-reflective questions about their motivation to study and let us know what areas of study they're considering. To be eligible for scholarships via this form, students must have

a University of Sydney course in their UAC preferences by 29 September. They only need to complete the form once (unless their circumstances change) and upon successful completion will be considered for equity and/or merit-based scholarships depending on their circumstances.
